Text must be double spaced, left justified, with one-inch margins, and the initial word of each paragraph must be indented. Footnotes must be single spaced with double spacing between footnotes, left justified, and appear at the bottom of each page. Text and footnote citations should conform with the rules set forth in The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation (17th ed. 2000).

Manuscripts should be submitted to the Executive Editor at the address indicated below. If any portion of a manuscript has been published previously, or is to be published elsewhere, such information must be disclosed at the time of submission of the manuscript to the Law Review. Manuscripts cannot be returned. The Law Review will not assume responsibility for lost manuscripts.
