



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





Services designed to help infants and toddlers with disabilities or delays to catch up in their development. The focus is on helping babies and toddlers learn the basic and brand-new skills that typically develop during the first three years of life, such as: • Physical: such as reaching, rolling, crawling, and walking • Cognitive: such as thinking, learning, and solving problems • Communication: such as talking, listening, and understanding • Social/emotional: such as playing, and feeling secure and happy • Self-help: such as eating and dressing


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








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Eligibility: birth through 2 years who have at least one of the following: **BEFORE 24 MONTHS** ELARC; 28 months old at time of evaluation 33% delay in one area Auditory comprehension = 27 months • Expressive Communication = 21 months ➤ 24+ MONTHS • Total Language = 24 months 50% delay in one area OR Kaiser Report; 29 months old at evaluation • Receptive Language = 32 months 33% delay in 2+ areas • Expressive Language = 17 months STANDARDIZED TESTS 1/3 below age expectation

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Delivery of Services The Department of Developmental Services (DDS) has been designated as the lead agency responsible for the administration and coordination of the statewide service delivery system. The services are delivered through an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP). A service coordinator designated by the IFSP team is responsible for direct implementation of the plan, as well as coordination with other agencies.

67 (2) A timely, comprehensive, multidisciplinary evaluation must be provided to identify:

- (1) The child's $\underline{\text{unique strengths and needs}}$ in each of the five areas of assessment:
 - Cognitive development
- Physical and motor development
- Communication development
 Social or emotional development
- Adaptive development AND
- (2) Early intervention & other $\underline{\text{services appropriate to meet your child's }}$ and
- (3) The family's resources, priorities, and concerns AND the supports & services necessary to enhance the family's capacity to meet the developmental needs of their infant/toddler

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(4) Develop an IFSP

WHO: A multidisciplinary team, including the parents

- Develop the IFSP from the information provided by the assessment
- Identifies the services appropriate to meet such needs.

WHEN: The regional center or school district must develop an IFSP

• within 45 calendar days of the referral for early intervention services.

WHAT: The IFSP must be in writing and include:


- · A statement of present levels of development;
- A statement of the family's concerns, priorities and resources;
- A statement of the major outcomes to be expected
- and the criteria, procedures and time lines used to evaluate these outcomes;
- A statement of specific services
- including how often, how much, and the method of delivery;
- A statement of the "natural environments" in which early intervention services shall appropriately be provided,
 including a justification of the extent, if any, to which the services will not be provided in a natural environment;
- · Dates for starting services;
- Name of agency responsible for providing the identified services;
- · Name of the service coordinator; and
- A transition plan to other appropriate services.


