

Need help with your immigration forms? If you are not sure what immigration benefit to apply for, or which forms to submit, then you may need immigration legal advice from an authorized service provider. Authorized service providers are attorneys in good standing and representatives accredited by the Department of Justice (DOJ). They are allowed to give you advice about which documents to submit, explain immigration options that you may have, and communicate with USCIS about your case.

State of California Residents: Did you know that an immigration consultant in the state of California:

- Must provide a contract for immigration consultant services in English and the client's language;
- Must provide a signed receipt on his/her letterhead to you, the client, for each payment made;
- Be bonded with the State of California; and
- Cannot charge fees for USCIS Legal Forms.
