



NALC will assess your current status and determine your eligibility for legal assistance through the Clinic.

NALC provides quality immigration services to the community while training future attorneys in the following areas:

Naturalization Applications

If you are a Legal Permanent Resident (LPR), have been in the country for at least five years, and demonstrate good moral character, you have the option to become a U.S. citizen through the naturalization process.

U Nonimmigrant Status (U-Visas)

If you are a non-citizen who suffers from substantial physical or mental abuse as a result of having been a victim of certain criminal activity, and are helpful in the investigation or prosecution of the crime, you may be eligible for a U-Visa.

Family-Based Immigrant Visas

If you have a spouse, child, or other family members who are citizens you may be eligible for a Family-Based Immigrant Visa.

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)

If you are an immigrant with non-legal status who entered before the age of 16, are a high school graduate, have a GED, or are currently in school, have no criminal history, have continuously resided in the U.S. since June 15, 2007, and were present in the U.S. on June 15, 2012, you may be eligible for consideration of DACA.

NALC provides legal services at no charge; however, there may be required government filing fees which are the sole responsibility of the client.

NALC serves the needs of our local community and encourages immigrant integration by providing free consultations and free Naturalization/Citizenship services to Legal Permanent Residents of Fresno County and surrounding counties. NALC offers a series of workshops throughout the year to assist individuals with the Naturalization process. In addition, we provide free legal advice to low income families who seek assistance in applying for family based immigrant visas, wish to be considered for deferred action, or are victims of certain crimes. Persons with non-legal issues, who are in need of other services, are referred to resources available to them in the community.
