Curriculum

The Juris Doctor Degree can be completed in 3, 4, or 5 years, depending upon the individual student's needs and performance in law school. Whatever the time frame, the student must successfully complete 86 semester units with a cumulative grade point average of 65 or better to obtain the Juris Doctor degree.

Tuition Refund Policy

Drop Policy

Only classes dropped on or before 5:00pm September 8, 2025 are eligible for a tuition refund.

Withdrawal Policy

Students who completely withdraw from school may be eligible for a partial refund of tuition. For complete details see the Student Handbook.

Financial Aid

To apply for federal student loans you must complete the FAFSA, graduate level entrance counseling, and sign the master promissory note. All three of these tasks are completed through the Department of Education's website at http://studentaid.gov. The FAFSA must be completed each year prior to origination of the loan. Entrance counseling is only required once. The master promissory note is good for up to 10 years. There are no grants at the graduate level, only federal student loans.

You must also complete the SJCL financial aid application each year. It can be accessed at www.sjcl.edu/finaid. To apply, click on "Apply For Financial Aid," click "Applicant," enter your email and password, choose the appropriate school year, and follow the instructions. Contact Lisa Nilmeier at lnilmeier@sjcl.edu or 559/326-1482 with any questions or problems.

At the time you complete online registration, students will be able to determine if their financial aid disbursement will cover the full amount of the semester's tuition and fees or if they will have a balance due to SJCL. If the student has a balance due to SJCL after their net loan amount is disbursed, they will receive an email from accounting on the first day of the semester with the balance and due date of the payment. Students are expected to purchase books with their own resources.

Tuition, registration, technology, and student association fees payments will not be required by the beginning of the semester if the student has completed the financial aid process and returned the offer letter. If you are using financial aid and have a balance due you will need to pay by 4:30 pm on August 22, 2025. All other students must pay their tuition and fees by 6:15 pm on August 18, 2025.

Textbooks

A booklist will be available online approximately June 30, 2025. It will be posted under First Year Student Files.

- All students must purchase books using their own resources.
- The estimated cost of books for the first year totals \$1,000 \$1,700 depending on if you purchase new or used.

Four-Year Program

SJCL's Four-Year Program is designed for a diverse community. The curriculum is intended to accommodate the needs of working students, parents, commuters, and others who have substantial commitments outside of their studies. The program requires an average of ten classroom hours each week throughout the four years. A student should expect to spend approximately two to three hours in preparation time for each hour of classroom time. The program is designed primarily as a night program, but there are some daytime sections of classes offered depending on demand and availability.

Three-Year Option

Students in the Four-Year Program who complete the first year with a minimum cumulative GPA of 75 can accelerate their studies by transferring to the Three-Year Option. Students who wish to transfer to the Three-Year Option are required to meet with the Director of Student Services, Academic Dean, Dean of Students, or Dean for approval before transferring. If receiving financial aid, the transferring student must also meet with the Director of Financial Aid. The Three-Year Option requires students to take additional courses during the second and third year of the program and complete a minimum of four (4) clinical units. Any outside employment in excess of (20) hours per week is prohibited.

The Student Bar Association also coordinates the Student Mentoring Program. In addition, the Student Bar Association sponsors scholarships.

Christian Legal Society

The Christian Legal Society (CLS) is a nationwide Christian fellowship committed to acting justly, loving mercy, and walking humbly with their God. Founded in 1961, CLS defends religious liberties for all Americans in the legislatures and the courts and serves those most in need in our society through Christian Legal Aid. They are organized in more than 1100 cities into attorney chapters and law student chapters across the United States. Four students committed to creating a faith based fellowship on campus founded the CLS chapter at SJCL in September 2017.

Delta Theta Phi

We encourage law students to consider being a member of the nation's premier law fraternity. Delta Theta Phi, which can trace its roots to 1900, has initiated more than 136,000 members locally, across the country, and in several other nations. Many of our members are distinguished persons in government, in business, in international affairs, on the judiciary, and in the general practice of law. 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
