## Speed Mentoring Event on Campus

The Hon. Pahoua Lor (Law '08) and Hon. Maria Diaz partnered the local chapter of the Unity Bar with SJCL to present a “Speed Mentoring” opportunity for students and newer attorneys in September. The concept resembled speed dating, but rather than chatting with potential dates, participants rotated between panels of judges and attorneys who answered any and all questions about the legal field. Groups of students were given 15 minutes to chat and ask questions at each of six “mentor stations,” where a mixed panel of judges and attorneys shared some experiences and advice. When a bell signaled the end of each session, the student groups were escorted to the next mentor station. At the conclusion of the sessions, students and mentors came together at a reception where they mingled, enjoyed refreshments, and planned further discussions if desired. Rachel Baskin (Law '19), a Fresno County Deputy District Attorney and domestic violence survivor, served as the keynote speaker at the highly prestigious Marjaree Mason Center Top Ten Professional Women Awards. At the age of 23, Rachel was attacked, along with her mother and brother, by her estranged husband. Rachel was shot in the head and her throat was cut, but she survived, as did her mother and brother from similar injuries. Resilient beyond measure, Rachel went on to law school and became a prosecuting attorney who, like the Top Ten Professional Women honored in August, has exemplified success, professional excellence, and leadership in her role as a Deputy District Attorney.

# Four Inducted into Hall of Fame

An overflow crowd of colleagues, family, friends, and classmates celebrated the newest inductees to the SJCL Hall of Fame in October.

A record number of candidates, 16 in all, had been nominated by fellow classmates for the honor. That list was eventually whittled down to four: Robert Broughton, Eric Christiansen, Hon. Pahoua Lor, and Dennis Mederos. Among additional considerations, the selection criteria for induction includes:

- Exemplary dedication to the field of law
- Exceptional standard of ethics and professional competence
- Professional achievement and service that has had a profound positive influence
- Brought recognition and honor to themselves and SJCL

With so many accomplished and dedicated graduates - more than 1,500 throughout SJCL's 57 year history - it's a struggle each year to reach a decision.



**Dennis Mederos** (Law '77) began his career in the Fresno County Public Defender's Office. In 1980 he entered private practice in Tulare where he was soon named partner at Soars, Rowson, Horswill & Mederos. Throughout his 45-year legal career he earned the respect of his peers, and often represented fellow attorneys, judges, and politicians. In 2022 Dennis received the TCBA Distinguished Service Award for exemplary service, legal excellence, professionalism, and ethics.

Dennis played a significant role in saving the Tulare District Hospital (now Adventist Hospital) by contributing his legal skills pro bono in a successful campaign to rid the hospital of corruption. Dennis was elected to the Tulare City Council in 2018 and served as Mayor of Tulare for three years. He has served on the Tulare County LAFCO, Citizens Advisory Committee of the San Joaquin Air Pollution Control District, and Mid Kaweah GSA. Other notable recognitions include: 2013 Tulare Man of the Year, the Golden Apple Award from the Association of California School Administrators, and induction into the Tulare Western High School Wall of Fame. Dennis' practice of law and principles were known by his colleagues to be unmatched.



**Robert Broughton** (Law '78) worked as a deputy Public Defender after law school, first in Tulare, and then in Contra Costa County for seven years. He became a commissioner there in 1986, where he served for 26 years. In addition, he taught at the National Judicial College in Reno, Nevada, the California New Judge Orientation Program, and the California B.E. Witkin Judicial College. He also served as a Curriculum and Faculty Developer/Instructor in the California mandatory Judicial Ethics Training program, as well as the California Judges Association Legislative Relations and Ethics Committee. Robert was a Vice President of the California Judges Association, President of the California Court Commissioners Association Board, and a member of CJA's Ethics Opinion Committee.

Soon after his retirement in 2012, he was appointed to serve as the American Bar Association/ National Highway Traffic Safety Association Judicial Outreach Liaison for California, Arizona, Hawaii, and the Pacific Islands. In addition, Robert taught at the John F. Kennedy School of Law and served as a Community Court Hearing Officer.


**Eric Christensen's** (Law '83, center) law career included more than 100 jury trials and over 36 years as a Public Defender.



The **Hon. Pahoua Lor** (Law '08, 3rd from L), still in the early days of her career, has already broken through several glass ceilings.



Throughout his 45-year legal career, **Dennis Mederos** (Law '77, 2nd from R), has represented fellow attorneys, judges, and politicians.



**Eric Christensen** (Law '83) developed his love for the law when he competed in forensics tournaments in school. He enrolled at SJCL after college and worked at the 5th District Court of Appeals Clerk's Office, and later an insurance defense firm, throughout. After passing the bar, Eric did piece work for a variety of local lawyers in legal research, writing motions, and appellate briefs. Four months later he was hired at the Fresno County Public Defender's Office, where he served for more than 36 years. During his career Eric completed well over 100 jury trials, including numerous homicides. Nicknamed "the Viking" by his peers, Eric is known as a "dedicated champion for the poor". He has inspired young attorneys and legal interns to become passionate advocates in criminal defense. Even in retirement, Eric continues to be a defender of justice as he works as a contract attorney.



**Hon. Pahoua Lor** (Law '08) became the first Hmong female to be appointed to the bench in Fresno County. In 2022 she was appointed to the Superior Court bench by Governor Newsome. Prior to her appointment, Judge Lor served as a sole practitioner and part-time immigration attorney. With a childhood that combined the traditional Hmong values of her family with the need to assimilate in the US after immigrating from Laos, Judge Lor strived to preserve her heritage while forging new possibilities for her community. She has been instrumental in bringing a chapter of the Unity Bar to the Central Valley, and serves as a member of several professional and community organizations.


