## Organizing For Our Lives: New Voices From Rural Communities

Organizing For Our Lives: New Voices From Rural Communities, by Richard Steven Street<sup>1</sup> and Samuel Orozco,<sup>2</sup> (NewSage Press and California Rural Legal Assistance (1992)), portrays the efforts and accomplishments of California's rural citizens. The photo essay book serves three purposes: commemoration, celebration, and education as to issues pertinent to the rural poor.

First, the book commemorates the twenty-fifth anniversary of California Rural Legal Assistance, an agency which provides countless hours of free legal services to the rural poor. Second, the book is an acknowledgement of the struggles of California's rural citizens, as well as a celebration of their fortitude to pursue better lives and work conditions through activism. Finally, the book is a tool for education. It will enlighten the public as to the plight of the rural poor, but more importantly it will serve as a model for all grassroots organizations striving to enact social change.

The book examines six grassroots organizations, focusing on the people as well as their accomplishments. These groups changed the cultural and political schemes of their individual communities, through group organization and empowerment. The efforts of these citizens is evidenced in the schools, farms, shops, and housing projects within their communities.

The message throughout Organizing For Our Lives is that we can each make a difference through activism and group organization.
